24/030 MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

RESOLVED council members unanimously approved the February minutes, which were signed by the chair as an accurate record, with no amendments.

24/031 PUBLIC OPEN FORUM Opened at 19.30

Dog fouling: a resident complained about dog mess on The Plantation grass and on the village streets. SCDC owns the Plantation land so any signage would need to be put up by it. The parish council has its full complement of dog waste bins, so the chair will speak to the handyman about moving one bin to a better location. The residents also complained about parking in The Plantation: spaces get filled up by parents picking up children from the school bus. Cllr Ellington advised sending photos and times of the problem to the parking warden. The residents also want clarification of parking space allocation in The Plantation. Cllr Ellington will ask someone from SCDC to talk to the residents. Public forum closed at 19.48

24/019/2 District councillor, Sue Ellington's report:

Emergency meeting: SCDC is holding an emergency meeting on 21 March to approve the borrowing of £200 million to build 256 new homes at Cambourne. Cllr Ellington is concerned about water supply and sewage, which all goes to Utton's Drove.

Community warden scheme: SCDC has agreed funding for 2024-25.

24/033 VILLAGE CRIME

033/1 New crime reports or issues: the lock up door was damaged over the weekend of 9/10 March. The police were called and a crime number allocated.

033/2 Other crime issues: strangers and unknown vehicles have been observed around the village especially around Oaktree Road/Stubbins area.

(23/086) Pavilion donations: no change from the last meeting.

(23/129) Community warden: SCDC has agreed to fund the scheme for 2024-25.

24/036 VILLAGE MAINTENANCE

036/1 Damage to left hand lock up door: the handyman repaired on Monday, 11 March. 036/2 Handyman's report/any other issues: RESOLVED council members unanimously agreed to use logs from the elms due to be felled on 17 April as sleepers to mark out car parking spaces in the village hall car park. The handyman has spoken with contractors on the affordable housing site who will flatten the car park floor. The PC will then only need to purchase boulders from Bannolds to stop people parking on the grass areas.

The handyman will be off work from 4 April for knee surgery and has organised cover for grass cutting. The MVAS will not be moved or have its battery charged while the handyman is away.

24/037 MUGA/PUMP TRACK

Council members agreed the pump track would be better for families than a MUGA, which is better for organised team sports. The location, village hall field or football field, is to be agreed. R Davies will contact Clark & Kent for comparative costings for the football field. ACTION The PC will submit a funding expression of interest to Thalia (was Amey). ACTION The PC will also look at lottery and SCDC for further funds. ACTION

24/038 SCHOOL BUS STOPS

The school bus company is changing the pick-up location from the village hall to The Plantation/Cootes Lane for safety reasons. The return drop off point will stay the same.

SCDC has agreed funding for 2024-25.

RESOLVED The PC will subscribe to Creative Arts East who host live events for communities in the east of England with a view to having a live theatre show in the village during November or December.
